Agenda item No. 4: Moderation of Marks (End Semester Examinations) as per University guidelines.

The affiliating university JNTUA has formed the guidelines for the Moderation of Marks from the Academic Year (2021-22). Taking that into account the guidelines for Moderation and Normalization of Marks at MITS are framed as below:

❖ Moderation marks shall be applicable only for Theory Subjects in B.Tech programs from the Academic Year 2021-22 admitted batch onwards.

General Moderation:

- General Moderation shall be applicable for both Regular and Supplementary Examinations.
- ❖ General Moderation shall not be applicable to any subject where the internal marks scored are below 16 marks (40% of 40 marks).

Up.

The addition of marks up to 1% of the total maximum marks of all the theory subjects in that Year or Semester as moderation to the external examination marks of any subject in which the student got failed, is permitted provided that the addition of marks as stipulated will result in the student passing that subject as per passing criteria of end semester examinations.

E.g.: Assume there are 6 theory subjects in a semester of 100 maximum marks each.

Total marks of all 6 subjects = $6 \times 100 = 600 \text{ marks}$

Maximum moderation marks = 1% of 600 = 6 marks.

Maximum moderation marks can be distributed to one/more subjects, in which the candidate may pass.

Special Moderation:

Special moderation to the extent of 1.5% of the total maximum marks of all the theory subjects in that Year or Semester may be added to the external marks of the failed subject, if the pass percentage in that subject is less than 40% after the implementation of the general moderation, provided the addition of marks as stipulated will result in the student passing that subject. Special moderation is permitted only when the Post Special Moderation pass percentage of that particular subject becomes greater than or equal to 40%.

This special moderation shall be applied only based on the recommendation of the moderation committee after approval of university nominee for results declaration. This special moderation is applicable only for regular examinations.

Case I: If a candidate had availed general moderation, then special moderation marks shall be as given below:

Special Moderation Marks for a Student = 1.5% of the total maximum marks of all the theory subjects in that Year or Semester minus the Marks availed in general moderation.

Case II: If a candidate had not availed General Moderation, then the Special Moderation marks shall be 1.5 % of the total maximum marks of all Theory subjects.

It was decided to introduce the Course on Universal Human Values for 3 Credits in R20 B.Tech Regulations for Regular Students admitted from 2021-22 onwards and Lateral Entry Students admitted from 2022-23 onwards. This Course shall be offered in B.Tech III Year I/II Semester.

As a result of addition of 3 credits, the total credits for the award of degree shall increase from 160 to 163 for Regular 2021-22 admitted batch onwards. Further for lateral entry students admitted from 2022-23 onwards, the total credits for the award of degree shall increase from 121 to 124.

All the external members recommended that students belonging to these batches can undergo internships either in online/ offline mode based on Students interest and availability.

- Condonation of shortage of attendance in aggregate up to 10% (65% and above and below 75%) in each semester may be granted by the College Academic Committee.

- Con

- Students whose shortage of attendance is not condoned in any semester are not eligible to take their end examination of that class and their registration shall stand cancelled.
- A student will not be promoted to the next semester unless he/she satisfies the attendance requirements of the present semester, as applicable. They may seek readmission for that semester when offered next.
- A stipulated fee shall be payable towards Condonation of shortage of attendance to the Institution provided a student has a minimum of 40% attendance in each course.

Relative Weightage for Internal Evaluation and End Semester Examination

Prior to the conduct of Academic Council meeting, it was proposed to go with 30 marks for internal assessment and 70 marks for End Semester Examination.

After the deliberations with the members it has been decided to follow 40 marks for internal assessment and 60 marks for End Semester Examination.

A student shall be promoted from II to III year only if he/she acquires 40% of the credits from the courses that have been studied up to II year I semester from the following examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the end semester examination or not as per the normal course of study.

- a. One regular and two supplementary examinations of I Year I Semester.
- b. One regular and one supplementary examinations of I Year II Semester.
- c. One regular examination of II year I semester

A student shall be promoted from III to IV year only if he/she acquires 40% of the credits from the courses that have been studied up to III year I semester from the following examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the end semester examination or not as per the normal course of study.

- a. One regular and four supplementary examinations of I year I semester.
- b. One regular and three supplementary examinations of I year II semester.
- c. One regular and two supplementary examinations of II year I semester.
- d. One regular and one supplementary examinations of II year II semester.
- e. One regular examination of III year I semester.

The Syllabus of I Year B.Tech was discussed in detail and approved by the committee.

Agenda item No.4: Ratification of Academic Regulations – R18, Course Structures and Syllabi of M.Tech programmes: Structural Engineering, Electrical Power Systems, Advanced Manufacturing Systems, Digital Electronics & Communication Systems and Computer Science & Engineering.

The Academic Regulations - R18 for all M.Tech programmes, their course structures and the syllabi were discussed and approved as laid on the table.

Agenda item No.5: Ratification of Academic Regulations - R18, Course Structure and Syllabus of MBA programme

The Course Structure, Syllabus and each item in the Academic Regulations are discussed and resolved as laid on the table.

Agenda item No.6: Ratification of Academic Regulations – R18, Course Structures and Syllabi of MCA (Three year programme) & MCA (Two year programme)

The Course Structure, Syllabus and each item in the Academic Regulations are discussed and resolved as laid on the table.

The distribution of marks for P.G. Programmes i.e., M.Tech, MBA, MCA (three year programme) & MCA (two-year program) under R-18 Academic regulations shall be evaluated course wise, with a maximum of 100 marks for Theory / Practice, on the basis of Internal Evaluation and End Semester Examination. For the theory/practical courses 40 marks are allotted for internal evaluation (There shall be two Mid-term tests of 30 marks each & 10 marks for two Assignments-5 marks each) and 60 marks for End Semester Examination.

However, the students who are admitted to II year MCA (three year programme) under Lateral entry during 2018-19 shall be offered the same number of credits and courses as applicable for II & III year MCA, under R-16 Academic Regulations.

Agenda item No.7: Student High Action Research Program—SHARP

The Council hailed the launch of **Student High Action Research Program—SHARP** with a budget of Rs. 60 Lakh, to pay Stipend of Rs.1000/- per month for 600 students from 1st year to 3rd year towards Research work. However, it was advised to exclude I year students, as it was felt too early for them.

Agenda item No.8: Any other matter with permission of the Chair

a. Inclusion of a virtual lab in III year BTech, without credits, is accepted.

The following suggestions / proposals were made for implementation in due course of time:

- a. To send the faculty having projects to Asia University, Taiwan for getting trained in patenting, thereby develop research collaborations and design activities. Also to send M Tech students during their project work.
- b. To attract students with foreign nationality and thereby establish diversity among students.
- c. To get all the approvals from state govt. and the university towards the admission of students from Nepal.
- d. To create vacancies for full-time PhD scholars which also fulfills a requirement for NIRF.
- e. To create group e-mail IDs of all the external members and mail any achievements / information of the institute.
- f. To conduct AC Meetings twice a year.
- g. To inform the progress made regarding EPIC & SHARP.

The Minutes of the Fourth Meeting of the Academic Council held on Saturday, 2nd July, 2016 at 10.40 am in the Board Room of MITS with the Principal Dr. C. Yuvaraj in the chair.

The Chairman welcomed all the members and the Member Secretary introduced them to each other.

The Council paid condolences to the former Vice-Chancellor of JNTUA Prof Krishna Gandhi whose sudden demise happened on 1.7.2016.

The Chairman presided over the meeting. At the outset, he presented the following brief report on the achievements of MITS during the academic year 2015-16:

- a. Improvement in the results and pass percentage of 2014 admitted B Tech students (autonomous batch).
 - 57.37% results in I year (2014 autonomous batch) as against 45.58% results of I year 2013 batch (JNTUA).
 - 62.11% results in II year I Sem (2014 autonomous batch) as against 45.81% results of II year I Sem 2013 batch (JNTUA).
- b. Successful implementation of the submission of assignments through Moodle with Antiplagiarism check.
- c. Successful completion of first phase of Massive Open Online Courses by both UG & PG students during the II semester of 2015-16 academic year. 1208 students appeared for these courses and 95% results were achieved. One Mechanical Student secured 3rd place in the national level exam conducted by NPTEL.
- d. In a project competition organized by Motorola, where 350 colleges across the country participated, 31 projects were selected for final presentation. Of these 3 were from MITS one project stood 1st with a prize money of Rs. 75,000/- and another won a consolation prize money of Rs. 26,000/-
- e. Received Outstanding Engineering Institute South 2016 award from ABP news.
- f. MITS achieved 8 R&D projects worth of Rs. 1.4 crores during 2015-16. With this the institute has accrued more than Rs. 2 crores towards 28 projects.
- g. 150 students successfully completed their first level in foreign languages.
- h. NBA committee inspected MITS during April 2016 for the grant of Reaccreditation for UG programs and the results are awaited. MITS has also applied for accreditation of PG programs & is awaiting their visit.
- i. SSR is submitted to NAAC and their visit for inspection is awaited.

- There is an increase in Publications of faculty, particularly in Scopus indexed journals; as such MITS also participated in the NIRF.
- k. 8 of internal faculty are awarded with Ph.D last year.
- 1. With a recruitment of 47 Ph.D holders, there is an increase in the number of doctorates to 127 as against 80 of last year.
- m. Placement of 430 students in various companies indicates improvement in placements.
- n. Sports One student for Kabaddi, 2 for cricket and 1 for fencing from the institute represented JNTUA Inter university tournaments. MITS girls stood winners in Throwball and runners in Tennikoit in SELESTA 2K16 held at SVCET College in Chittoor.
- o. Better intake in Admissions 2016 when compared to those of previous years.
 - The last ranker under OC category joined in Civil is 25,000 as against 110,000 of last year.
 - The last ranker under OC category joined in ECE is 20,900 as against 56,000 of last year.

Then the agenda items were taken up for discussion.

Agenda item No.1: Confirmation of the minutes of the 3rd meeting of the Academic Council held on 29th July 2015.

The minutes of the 3rd meeting of the Academic Council were confirmed.

Agenda item No. 2: Action Taken Report

During the third meeting of the Academic Council it was proposed to consider introduction of gap year concept as per university guidelines in the near future.

As this was not taken up for discussion during the entire year, there is no ATR.

Agenda item No. 3: Approval for modifications in the course structures and regulations of B. Tech – R 14.

The following changes were made in Academic Regulations and Course Structure already approved by the Council during its first meeting on 28.10.2014:

a. Shifting of certain courses between III & IV years of B.Tech CE, EEE and ME as proposed by their respective BoS was discussed and resolved to be accepted as laid on the table.

• Modifications in the course structure of CE

- 1. Construction Equipment, Planning and management a course of IV Year II semester has been moved to Discipline Elective III of IV Year I Semester
- Airport, Railways and Waterways a Discipline Elective III of IV Year I semester
 has been moved as a course to IV Year II semester with the course name Airports,
 Railways, Docs & Harbors
- 3. Quantity Surveying a course of IV Year II semester has been moved as a course of IV Year I semester
- 4. Environmental Pollution and Solid Waste Management a course of IV Year I semester has been moved to IV Year II semester with the course name Solid Waste Management

• Modifications in the course structure of EEE

- 1. The existing IV-Year B.Tech II Semester courses Artificial Intelligence and Electrical Power Utilization and Illumination are shifted to IV-Year B.Tech I Semester.
- 2. The existing IV-Year B.Tech I Semester courses Special Electrical Machines and Power System Analysis & Control are shifted to III-Year B.Tech II Semester.
- 3. The existing course in III-Year B.Tech II Semester Power Systems is shifted to III-Year B.Tech I Semester in place of Microelectronic Circuits.
- 4. The existing Analog & Digital VLSI Design course in III-Year B.Tech II Semester and Microelectronic Circuits course in III-Year B.Tech I Semester are shifted to IV-Year B.Tech II Semester.

• Modifications in the course structure of ME

- 1. Swap the courses Engineering Optimization and ICS between 3-2 and 4-1 semesters.
- 2. To swap the courses Industrial Engineering and Automation and Robotics between 4-1 and 4-2 semesters.
- 3. To swap CAD/CAM and FEM courses between 3-2 and 4-1 semesters.

b. Inclusion of the following clause in MOOCs guidelines was discussed and resolved to be accepted as laid on the table:

6.5.10. In case a student fails to complete the MOOCs he/she shall re-register for the same with any of the providers from the list provided by the department. Still if a student fails to clear the course/s, the Institution shall evaluate for the said course/s for 60 marks (scaled up to 100 marks), as per the Institution syllabi during the final year.

6.5.11. In case any provider discontinues to offer the course, Institution shall allow the student to opt for any other provider from the list provided by the department, for completion of the same.

c. Reconsideration of promotion rules

The modifications in the minimum academic requirements as mentioned below were proposed and the same were resolved to be accepted.

8. Minimum Academic Requirements

Students need to acquire necessary credits to get promoted to the subsequent academic yearin addition to the attendance requirements mentioned in section no.5.

- 8.1 The minimum letter grade required for pass in each theory/practical/Seminar/Project work is "P" (internal evaluation + End Semester Examination). However a minimum of 40% marks in each theory/practical in the end semester examination have to be secured.
- 8.2 If a student found to be guilty due to malpractice in the end semester examinations, he/she shall be awarded a letter grade "F".
- 8.3 A student shall be promoted from II to III year only if he/she acquires 40% of the credits from the courses that have been studied up to II year I semester from the following examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the end semester examination or not as per the normal course of study.
- a. One regular and three supplementary examinations of I Year I Semester.
- b. One regular and two supplementary examinations of I Year II Semester.
- c. One regular and one supplementary examination of II year I semester
- 8.4 A student shall be promoted from III to IV year only if he/she acquires 40% of the credits from the courses that have been studied up to III year I semester from the following examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the end semester examination or not as per the normal course of study.
- a. One regular and five supplementary examinations of I year I semester.
- b. One regular and four supplementary examinations of I year II semester.
- c. One regular and three supplementary examinations of II year I semester.
- d. One regular and two supplementary examinations of II year II semester.
- e. One regular and one supplementary examination of III year I semester.
- 8.5 In case a student is detained due to lack of required credits for promotion to the next academic year, he/she needs to obtain the same by taking the supplementary examinations.
- 8.6 Students, who fail to earn 180 credits as indicated in the course structure within eight academic years from the year of their admission, shall forfeit their seat in B.Tech. Programme and their admission shall stand cancelled.

- d. Inclusion of the following clause for Soft Skills in the academic regulations was discussed and resolved to be accepted as laid on the table:
- 6.7.2. Soft Skills
- 6.7.2.1 The relative weightage for internal evaluation and end semester examination shall be 40% and 60% respectively.
- 6.7.2.2 Out of 40 marks allotted for internal evaluation, the day to day oral presentations of the students during practice hours, shall be evaluated for 20 marks by the course instructor concerned. The remaining 20 marks shall be awarded on the basis of two mid-term tests. The duration of mid-term test shall be 1 hour and 30 minutes. Student shall answer four questions (out of six) each carrying five marks. First mid-term test shall be conducted for I & II units of syllabus and second mid-term test shall be conducted for III, IV & V units. The average marks secured from I & II mid-term tests shall be the final mid-term marks.
- 6.7.2.3 In the end semester examination there shall be 5 questions, either-or type, of 12 marks each. 5 Questions shall cover one unit each with internal choice. The duration of External exam shall be 3 hours.

e. Conversion of SGPA/CGPA to Percentage

It was proposed to apply the formula as mentioned below to convert Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)/ Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) into percentage.

SGPA to Percentage = $(SGPA - 0.5) \times 10$ CGPA to Percentage = $(CGPA - 0.5) \times 10$

The same was discussed and resolved to be accepted.

Agenda item No. 4: The following modifications in the relative weightage given to internal and external evaluation for courses in the PG programmes – M.Tech, MBA, MCA and Integrated programmes were proposed; the same were discussed and resolved to be accepted.

The performance of the candidate in each semester shall be evaluated course wise, for a maximum of 100 marks for Theory and 100 marks for practicals, on the basis of Internal Evaluation and End Semester Examination.

4.1 For the theory courses 50 marks will be for the End Semester Examination.

While 30 marks will be for Internal tests, based on two Mid Term-tests held, one in the middle of the Semester (I-II units) and another immediately after the completion of instruction (III, IV & V) units with three questions to be answered out of four in 2 hours, evaluated for 30 marks. Both tests shall carry equal weightage.

Another 20 marks will be based on submission of four assignments (5marks each). The first and second assignments are to be submitted before I Mid-Term Examination and the third and fourth assignments are to be submitted before II Mid-Term Examination.

- 4.2 For practical courses, 50 marks shall be for the End Semester Examinations and 50 marks will be for internal evaluation based on the day to day performance.
- 4.3 For Seminar there will be an internal evaluation of 100 marks. A candidate has to secure a minimum of Grade D to be declared successful. The assessment will be made by a board consisting of HOD and two internal experts at the end of IV semester instruction.
- 4.4 The minimum letter grade required for pass in each theory/practical course is "P" (internal evaluation + End Semester Examination). However, in the end semester examination for a course (theory/practical) it is mandatory to secure a minimum of 40% of the total marks.
- 4.5 In case the candidate does not secure the minimum academic requirement in any of the courses (as specified in 4.4.) he has to reappear for the Semester Examination either Supplementary or regular in that course, or repeat the course when next offered or do any other specified course as may be required.
- 4.6 In case any student is unable to appear at any one of the two mid-term tests in any theory course for genuine reasons (for example; medical), the Principal, Head of the department and concern faculty at their discretion may permit the conduct of one additional mid-term test after the second mid-term test in that course only after satisfying himself of the genuineness of the reason given by the student supported by appropriate documentation.

• Ranks are awarded based on the CGPA secured by the candidates for all the courses from first to final year,

Provided the candidate has:

- o Completed the entire programme in the college itself (excluding MOOCs).
- o Passed all the courses in first attempt only.
- o Not discontinued the programme for any period during the course of study.
- o Not been awarded any punishment for being involved in malpractice or indiscipline during the course of study in the Institute.
- In case, more than one student secures same CGPA, then first rank shall be awarded based on:
 - o Student who secured more number of letter grade "O"," A+" and so on in decrementing order of grades.
- After applying the above clause, if a tie still exists, then all such students shall be awarded the same rank.
- Certificate and medal/award shall be given to such students as an appreciation for their achievement.

- c. Massive Open Online Courses are implemented for B. Tech 2014 batch in 2015.

Agenda item No. 4: Ratification for II, III & IV B. Tech. Syllabus - R14

The Syllabi of 5 UG programmes – Civil, EEE, ECE, CSE and ME already approved by their respective BoS were discussed and resolved to be accepted as laid on the table.

Agenda item No. 5: Amendments to Regulations (R14)

The following changes were made in Academic Regulations and Course Structure already approved by the Council during its first meeting on 28.10.2014:

- a. All the members accepted to Introduce "Advanced Calculus" in First semester and "Linear Algebra & Complex Analysis" in II semester for all students of I B Tech
- b. Audit Courses: The members approved the Audit Courses and their evaluation process as laid on the table. They also proposed to add a few more Audit courses in the due course of time.
- c. CBCS Guidelines: The guidelines for introducing open electives under Choice Based Credit System laid on the table were resolved as approved. It was decided to collect options from the students one semester in advance and then plan accordingly, to ensure suitable automation of the system, and to counsel the students before they provide their options. Allotment shall be made by departmental committees.
- d. MOOCs Guidelines: The guidelines for introducing Moocs were resolved as approved. It was suggested to introduce them in II-II Sem instead of II I Semester for 14 batch students, to select the set of standard Moocs providers and opt for relevant courses. Students and teachers may sit together for MOOCS courses, so that teachers can guide students and clarify their doubts.

Agenda item No. 6: Approval of Regulations for B. Tech- Lateral Entry Scheme:

The Course Structures, Syllabi and each item in the Academic Regulations were discussed and resolved as accepted. It was proposed to offer bridge courses, in case a student finds difficulty to understand any new course due to lack of any prerequisites.

Agenda item No. 7: Approval for modifications in the course structures and regulations of three year MCA & Direct 2nd Year MCA for 2015 batch

The course structures of the above programmes, approved in 2014 were revised as below after discussions:

- a. 3 year MCA: The number of credits allotted to practice sessions is reduced to 2 from 3. A minor project carrying 8 credits in V Sem of III year MCA, a theory course by name "Optimization Techniques" of 4 credits in VI Sem, and a seminar with 3 credits in V Sem are introduced.
- b. Direct 2nd Year MCA: The number of credits allotted to practice sessions is reduced to 2 from 3 and credits allotted to project are increased to 21 from 18, finally reducing the total credits of the programme to 107 from 111.

At the outset, the Chairman welcomed the members. He expressed his gratitude to the UGC, New Delhi, Government of Andhra Pradesh and JNT University, Anantapur for granting autonomy to MITS for a period of six years wef the academic year 2014-15. He also conveyed his thanks to the Management for the support extended to the faculty in achieving the status of autonomy. The Member Secretary introduced all the members of the Academic Council.

The agenda items were then taken up for discussion.

Item No.1: Course Structure of the B.Tech programmes in EEE, ECE, CSE, ME and Civil, their Syllabi and Academic Regulations

The Course Structure, Syllabus and each item in the Academic Regulations were discussed in detail. It was resolved to accept them as laid on the table with the following modifications:

- It was decided to follow the same course structure, Syllabi and regulations for both regular shift and second shift B.Tech programmes. In this regard, it was suggested to anticipate the operational issues of second shift B.Tech programmes and facilitate accordingly.
- A minor redistribution of the Credits between Semster I-1(reduced by 1) and Semester IV-2 (increased by 1) was accepted.
- Regarding promotion rules, it was resolved to consider 50% of Credits instead of 40% secured by a student during the preceding three Semesters (I-1 to II-I) (inclusive) for promotion from Semester II-2 to Semester III-1 and the five preceding Semesters (I-1 to III-I) (inclusive) for promotion from Semester III-2 to Semester IV-1. Further, the Principal (Chairman, Academic Council) was requested to decide at the time of declaration of Semester I-1 results, whether to include the Credits secured in Semesters II-2 and III-2 also for promotion to III year and IV year respectively and get the decision ratified in the subsequent Academic Council meeting.
- In the grading system for the absolute marks range of 40-49, grade E be given for pass category with 5 grade points instead of 4.
- Accordingly CGPA required for award of class is modified as follows:

Item No.2: Course Structure of various M.Tech programmes – DECS, MNE, VLSI & Embedded systems, EPS, SPS, AMS, MD and CSE, their Syllabi and Academic Regulations

The JNTU-A nominees appreciated the starting of a novel M.Tech Programme in Solar Power Systems by MITS. As B.Tech graduates in ECE are also eligible to join this programme, it was suggested to offer a bridge course for them to fulfill the pre-requisites.

The Course Structure, Syllabus and each item in the Academic Regulations were discussed in detail. It was resolved to accept them as laid on the table with the following modifications:

- In the grading system for the absolute marks range of 50-59, grade D be given for pass category with 6 grade points instead of 5.
- · Accordingly, CGPA required for award of class is modified as follows:

Class	CGPA	
First Class with Distinction	≥ 8	Based on the aggregate of grades secured from 70 Credits
First Class	≥ 7 & < 8	
Pass Class	≥ 6 & < 7

Item No. 3: Course Structure of MBA programme, Syllabi and Academic Regulations

The Course Structure, Syllabi and each item in the Academic Regulations of the programme were discussed and it was resolved to accept them as laid on the table with the same modifications as accepted for the M.Tech programmes listed in Item No.2 above.

Item No. 4: Course Structures of MCA 3 year and MCA 2 year direct programmes, their Syllabi and Academic Regulations

The Course Structures, Syllabi and each item in the Academic Regulations of these programmes were discussed and it was resolved to accept them as laid on the table with the same modifications as accepted for the M.Tech programmes listed in Item No.2 above.

Item No.5: Any other item with the permission of the Chair

- Constitution and composition of the Boards of Studies for various Departments made by the Principal (as per lists enclosed in Annexure-V) were ratified by the Academic Council with no change.
- As 10 marks are allotted to assignments under internal evaluation, teachers of all the concerned courses were exhorted to implement this part with great care and sincerity. Each individual student should be asked to come up with their own topics which nonetheless should be related to the course. Emphasis should be laid on encouraging the creativity and originality of the students. It was also proposed to apply methods based on the latest technology to evaluate the assignments and eliminate plagiarism.
- The College was advised to take up the activities related to I-1 End Semester examinations immediately by finalizing the evaluation pattern and preparing the panels of examiners, which should be taken up for approval in the second Academic Council meeting.
