The Anti-Ragging Cell of MITS Deemed-to-be University organized an Anti-Ragging Day – Awareness Programme on 12 August 2026 at Seminar Hall-C, Saraswathi Block as part of the Anti-Ragging Week Celebrations with the objective of sensitizing students to the harmful consequences of ragging and reinforcing the importance of maintaining a safe, respectful, inclusive, and harmonious campus environment.

The programme was graced by Dr. G. Reddy Hemantha, Coordinator, Student Activity Centre; Dr. Subba Rao, Co-Coordinator; Dr. K. Chandramohan, Coordinator, Anti-Ragging Cell; Dr. P. Ramanathan, Principal; and the distinguished Chief Guest, Sri M. Ravi Naik, Circle Inspector of Police, Madanapalle Rural.

The programme commenced with a warm welcome address by Dr. K. Lakshmi Devi, Additional Coordinator, who highlighted the significant role of the Anti-Ragging Cell in creating awareness among

students, preventing incidents of ragging, monitoring the campus environment, and safeguarding the dignity and well-being of every student.

As part of the programme, Dr. K. Chandramohan, Coordinator, Anti-Ragging Cell, presented the report of the Cell, outlining its activities, initiatives, and preventive measures undertaken to promote a ragging-free campus. He emphasized the importance of discipline, responsible behaviour, and mutual respect among students. He further stated that no incident of ragging had been reported in the institution so far, appreciating the cooperation and responsible conduct of the student community. He called upon all students to maintain the same positive record in the current academic year and continue contributing towards a completely ragging-free campus.

The Principal, Dr. P. Ramanathan, addressed the gathering and emphasized that academic excellence must be complemented by dignity, discipline, empathy, mutual respect, and ethical conduct. He urged students to uphold the values of the institution and to contribute positively towards creating a safe and inclusive learning environment.



The highlight of the programme was the informative and insightful address by the Chief Guest, Sri M. Ravi Naik, Circle Inspector of Police, Madanapalle Rural. He sensitized the students about the UGC guidelines and regulations relating to the prevention of ragging and explained the collective responsibility of students, faculty members, and educational institutions in preventing and addressing ragging.

The Chief Guest also elaborated on the origin and evolution of ragging, explaining how practices that may initially have been associated with introducing or familiarizing senior and junior students have, in many instances, been misused and transformed into harmful and unacceptable forms of behaviour. He highlighted the serious consequences of ragging, including humiliation, harassment, fear, emotional distress, and physical and psychological harm.

Further, Sri M. Ravi Naik explained the legal provisions and punishments associated with ragging, emphasizing that ragging is not merely a matter of institutional discipline but may also attract serious legal consequences depending on the nature and severity of the offence. He advised students never to participate in, encourage, support, or remain silent about any form of ragging.

As a preventive measure, he encouraged students to maintain healthy, respectful, and dignified interactions between seniors and juniors and to refrain from any behaviour that could cause discomfort, humiliation, intimidation, or distress. He also urged students to seek timely assistance from the appropriate authorities whenever they encounter or witness an incident of ragging. He stressed that students should not hesitate to report such incidents due to concerns about the reputation or prestige of

the institution. Instead, timely reporting should be viewed as a responsible action that helps protect students, prevent recurrence, and preserve the dignity of the campus community.

As a mark of respect and gratitude for his valuable presence and guidance, Sri M. Ravi Naik, Circle Inspector of Police, Madanapalle Rural, was felicitated during the programme. The felicitation served as a gesture of appreciation for his valuable time, professional insights, and meaningful interaction with the student community.

The programme concluded with a Vote of Thanks, expressing sincere gratitude to the Management, Vice-Chancellor, Registrars, Principal, Chief Guest, Chief Coordinator, Coordinator & Co-Coordinator of Anti-Ragging Cell, Student Activity Centre, faculty members, students, and all those who contributed to the successful organization of the programme.
