- Address social challenges such as discrimination, early marriage, and gender-based violence.

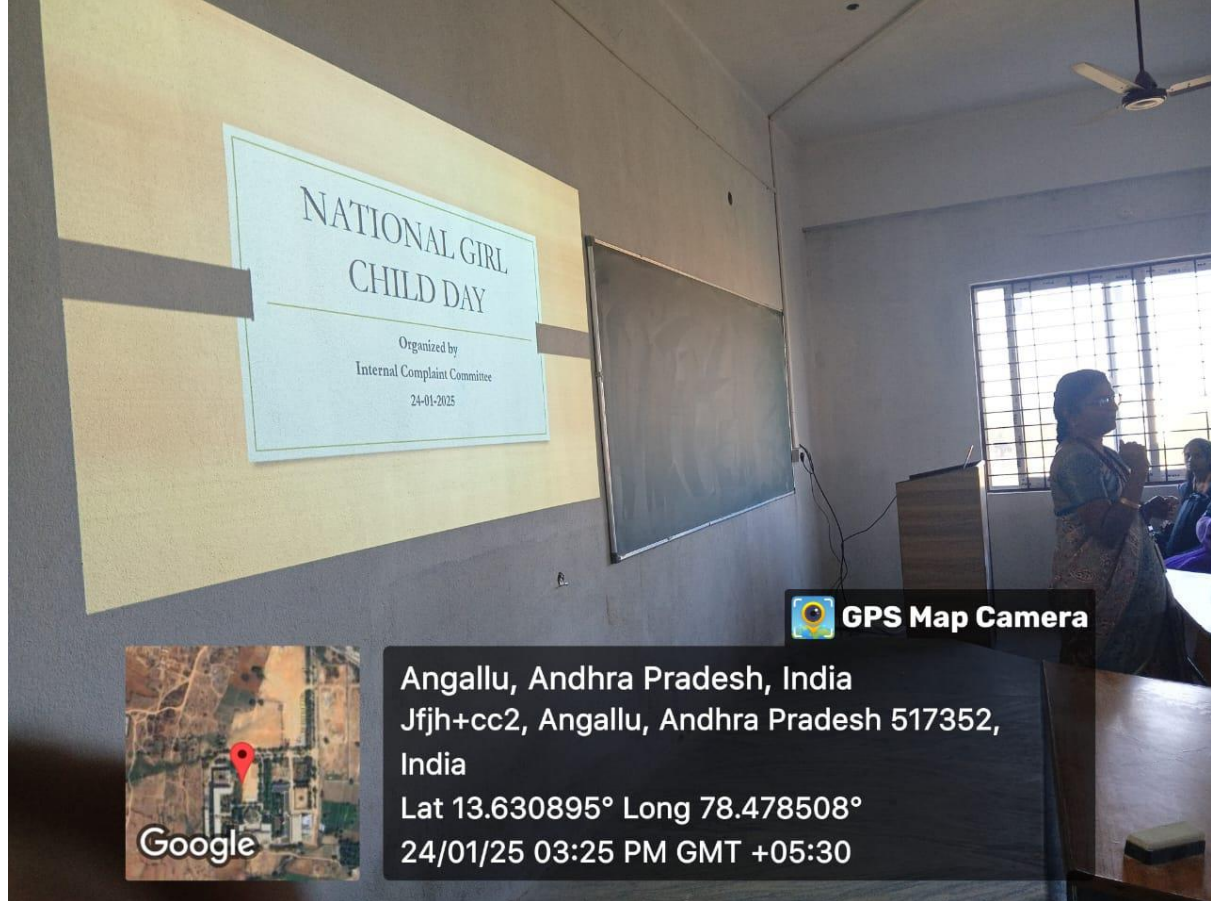
### **Session Highlights**
