





Report on "National Girl Child Day" organized by Internal Complaints Committee & Women Empowerment Cell of MITS on 24th Jan 2020

The event commenced at 4:00 PM in the presence of the Vice-Principal, Dr. Hampamma, International Relations Officer, Dr. Vijaya Lakshmi and the Chair Person of Internal Complaint Committee Dr. Geetha Devi as well as 120 girls. The program was inaugurated with the welcoming of the chief guests. The first speech was delivered by Dr. Hampamma articulating her views upon the role of a girl as a child, sister, wife, mother, grandmother etc. She reminded us a dialogue from a recent movie that spreads awareness on issues concerning girls in India. She narrated a story which stresses that how a girl shares, saves and thinks about the whole family whereas boys tend to be spendthrifts. Further, it was continued by Dr. Vijaya Lakshmi who informed students about the need for registering complaints without hesitation. She explained clearly to be proud as a girl like a free bird. She also motivated students to share their views regarding any issues. She discussed a girl's quality of being patient. Kokila from II year MBA delivered her speech where she discussed the role of a girl in a social scenario.
