infrastructural facilities like various clubs, sports, games, athletics, and the importance of library of MITS for a comfortable learning. He emphasised the importance of communication skills of English to face interview and get the job in the 21st century knowledge world. Students were advised to eliminate distractions from their life and concentrate on studies. The parents were briefed about the rules, and regulations of the college. He advised the students on the academic details and the importance of attendance.

Next to the Principal, Dr. K. Chandramohan explained about the importance of discipline in a student's life and requested the students and parents to understand and abide the institutional



rules and norms. He also mentioned three important points, the first about the attendance, the second is about IMS and the semester results, the third is about the discipline, punctuality for the institution. He also emphasised the measures

Dr. R. Thulasiram Naidu, represented the R&D cell of MITS and he informed the gathering that R&D cell is dealing with the four activities such as research projects, publications, patents, and consultancy. The institute has

received 18 crores of rupees from various funding agencies to carry out the research projects and students, research scholars, faculty etc are involved in the projects. He mentioned that five girls received 50 lakhs rupees to undertake MSME projects in the last year. The institute is having IPR cell with 1 crore rupees of funding from MSME Which will be helpful to get patents and to start any MSME start-ups. He emphasized that the institute is having top class faculties who received Doctoral Degrees from the premier institutes and who

published more than 2000 research papers in recent years. Hence, MITS, R&D cell encourages the students and staff towards the research.

He also pointed out that the students from the Department of Civil Engineering filed more than 20 patents and all the Civil Engineering laboratories are having National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) certification which was not found in any institution across India. Hence, the Department of Civil Engineering is working for consultancy which help to the government and private organizations to do the quality works. He also highlighted that MITS is supporting to the students who come with good ideas for entrepreneurship start-ups and encourages with basic capital if required through MITS incubation cell.

Mrs. U. Vijayalakshmi Senior Manager International relations cell explain about the cell and highlighted that the cell encourages the students who are talented and having good communication skills to get opportunities in the



abroad. She also informed that the first year and the second-year students are encouraged to participate in university innovation fellowship program which is being conducted by the Stanford University, USA. In this connection, fifty-six students were undergone the training, and four students are on pipeline. She also mentioned that MITS has MoUs with foreign universities in Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, and Germany. Hence, MITS students are encouraged towards the abroad opportunities.
