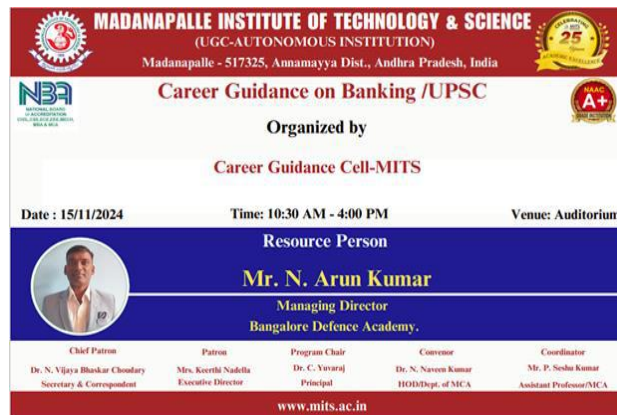


**A Report on Career Guidance Program on "Banking/UPSC"

The program was inaugurated on **Friday, 15th November 2024** by the Principal, **Dr. C. Yuvaraj**, alongside the resource person, **Mr. N. Arun Kumar**, Managing Director of the Bangalore Defense Academy, and ANO **Lt. N. Naveen Kumar**.

Inaugural Session Highlights:

The Principal, Dr. C. Yuvaraj, emphasized the relevance of career guidance initiatives, particularly for students aiming to secure positions in government services. He acknowledged the initiative as a crucial step towards equipping students with the necessary tools and strategies for competitive exams. The resource person, Mr. N. Arun Kumar, provided an overview of government examinations, highlighting their importance and how the forthcoming training sessions would be conducted.



Training Sessions:

The resource person engaged students in both **morning and afternoon sessions**, covering topics such as:

- Aptitude
- Polity
- General Knowledge
- Reasoning

The sessions included practical tips and tricks for tackling questions effectively. Over **750 students** enthusiastically participated, demonstrating their interest and making the event a grand success. The overwhelming response has motivated NCC organizers to continue the program for the next consecutive weeks.

Examination Insights:

During the sessions, the following competitive exams were detailed:

1. UPSC (Union Public Service Commission):

- One of the toughest exams globally, requiring determination, willpower, and dedication.
- Key subjects: Indian Polity, History, Geography, Economics, General Knowledge, Current Affairs, and Aptitude.
- Emphasis on preparation strategies and the need for complete focus to excel.

2. Banking Examinations:

- Popular among middle-class families due to their perception as secure government jobs.
- Key areas: Basic Aptitude, Reasoning, English Language, General Knowledge, and Current Affairs.

3. SSB/SSC Examinations:

SSB (Service Selection Board): For entry into Indian Defense Services.

1. Requires physical and mental agility along with preparation for tasks like TAT (Thematic Apperception Test), GD (Group Discussion), OIR (Officer Intelligence Rating), PPDT (Picture Perception and Discussion Test), and story narration.

SSC (Staff Selection Commission): Offers opportunities through CHSL, CGL, MTS exams for graduates, undergraduates, and non-graduates in state and central government roles like clerks, multi-tasking staff, and hawaladars.

Outcomes of the Program:

- **Understanding Career Opportunities:** Students gain insights into various roles and career paths available in the banking sector and through the UPSC (Union Public Service Commission) examinations, including eligibility, responsibilities, and growth opportunities.
- **Awareness of Preparation Strategies:** Students learn about effective preparation techniques, recommended study materials, and time management strategies for cracking banking exams (e.g., IBPS, SBI PO) and UPSC exams.
- **Skill Development:** The program enhances essential skills such as analytical reasoning, problem-solving, communication, and general awareness, which are crucial for success in competitive exams and professional roles.
- **Motivation and Goal Setting:** Students are inspired by success stories and practical tips from experts, helping them set clear career goals and develop a roadmap to achieve them.
- **Information on Application and Selection Process:** Participants acquire detailed knowledge about the application processes, examination formats, syllabus, and interview techniques for banking and UPSC exams, reducing confusion and anxiety about the procedures.
