Objective of the Session

The Training & Placement Cell conducted an interaction session with the I MCA students on 4th May 2026 at the KKB Seminar Hall. The objective of the session was to motivate students towards career planning, skill development, effective utilization of technology, communication enhancement, and preparation for future placement opportunities.

Key Highlights of the Session

Address by Training & Placement Team

1. **Dr. V. Jayaprakasan** - Assoc. Professor Dept. of ECE & Assoc. Dean – Training & Placements

Dr. V. Jayaprakasan motivated the students to adopt a focused and disciplined approach towards their careers and emphasized the importance of continuous self-improvement.

His key messages included:

- Students should utilize technology effectively and dedicate **3–4 hours every day for learning and skill development** instead of spending excessive time on social media and entertainment.
- The impact of **Artificial Intelligence is rapidly transforming industries**, and many routine or low-skill jobs are likely to be replaced by AI-driven solutions.
- Students should aim for **high-paying career opportunities** by developing advanced technical and professional skills.
- AI-powered tools and platforms can be utilized for:
 - Interview preparation
 - Coding practice
 - Technical assessments
 - Skill enhancement
- Every student should prepare a **clear career roadmap** and set specific goals for their future.
- Students were encouraged to identify their strengths and weaknesses, work consistently on improvement, and maintain a record of their learning journey.
- He advised students to write down their career aspirations and package targets, such as 3 LPA, 6 LPA, 12 LPA and beyond, and then systematically work towards achieving those goals.
- He stressed the importance of developing a growth mindset and maintaining focus on long-term career success.

Inspirational Message

Dr. V. Jayaprakasan concluded his interaction by encouraging students to dream big, work hard, and prepare themselves for future opportunities with determination and consistency.

2. **Dr. S. V. Rasajna**, Soft Skills Trainer

- It was observed that several students hesitate to speak despite having good ideas due to communication barriers. They were motivated to interact more confidently and engage in discussions and presentations.

7. Dr. K. Dasthagiri Basha, Quantitative / Reasoning Aptitude Trainer

The students were provided with information regarding:

- Major career opportunities available after MCA.
- Importance of choosing the right specialization based on interests and industry demand.
- Emerging opportunities in Artificial Intelligence, Data Analytics, Software Development, Cloud Computing, and related domains.
- The significance of continuous upskilling to remain relevant in the evolving job market.
