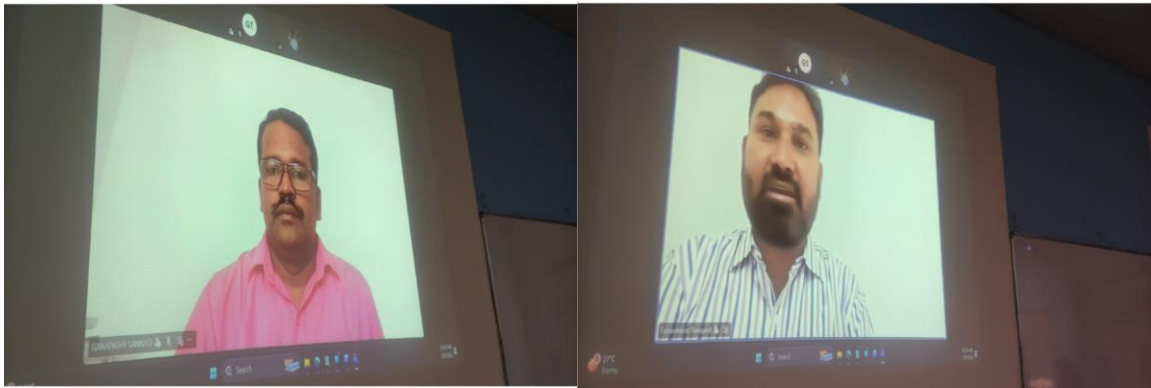


Principal and Dean School of Computing felicitated the Chief Guest with shawl and memento.
