

Report on International Delegation from BRNO University of Technology Czech Republic – Europe - Visit from 20-02-2023 to 23-02-2023

Prof. Jiri HAZE Head of Microelectronics Dept and Dr. Pavel STEFFAN Associate Professor and Secretary of the Dept of Microelectronics in BRNO University of Technology – Czech Republic- Europe visited MITS from 20-02-2023 to 23-02-2023. It was a three-day Program of International Delegation from BRNO University of Technology – Czech Republic- Europe.

Many queries and the doubts of the students had been addressed. The international relations office facilitated the delegation to enter into MoU and the program turned to be highly successful.
