Karnataka Silk Industries Corporation (KSIC) located in Mysore; a company known for its iconic Mysore Silk sarees. The visit was organized to help the students to understand how silk is produced and to witness the production process firsthand. KSIC, which was established in 1912 under the Mysore Maharajas, is renowned for combining traditional craftsmanship with modern technology to create world-class silk products

Objectives of the visit

The main objective of the visit was to provide a comprehensive understanding of the silk production process from start to finish. It aimed to help us learn about the history and heritage of KSIC and its role in promoting Mysore Silk, observe the use of advanced machinery alongside traditional craftsmanship, and gain insights into quality control measures. Additionally, the visit offered an opportunity to understand the challenges faced by the silk industry and explore potential career opportunities within the textile sector

Activities in the visit

The visit started with a warm welcome by the KSIC team, who gave us a brief history of the organization and its operations. We were then taken on a guided tour through the various stages of silk production:

- 1. **Raw Silk Processing:** The first stage involved processing raw silk cocoons. We observed how the cocoons are boiled, unwound, and turned into fine silk threads. This stage was fascinating as it showcased the intricate process of extracting silk.
- 2. **Dyeing:** Next, we visited the dyeing section, where the silk threads were colored using vibrant and eco-friendly dyes. The staff explained the importance of preserving traditional dyeing methods while ensuring environmental sustainability.
- 3. **Weaving:** The weaving process was a highlight of the visit. Skilled artisans demonstrated their expertise in creating intricate patterns on the fabric using handlooms and power looms. This step highlighted the blend of human skill and machine precision.
- 4. **Quality Control and Finishing:** Finally, we observed the quality control measures in place to ensure that every silk saree meets KSIC's high standards. This included checks for texture, durability, and the signature shine that Mysore Silk is known for.



The visit highlighted the intricate process of silk production, emphasizing the integration of traditional skills and modern technology. The students learned about the journey of raw silk cocoons to luxurious sarees, the importance of quality control, and the challenges faced by the industry.
