The session started with introducing Ms. Madhuri R, welfare officer to the students by Alumni coordinator Dr. K. Venkateswarlu.

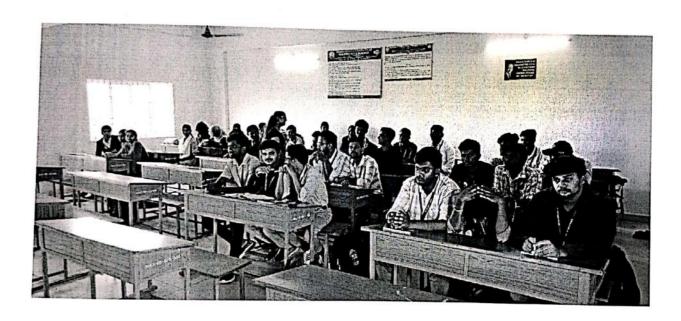


The speaker focussed on different tips to be followed to survive in the corporate world. Some of the tips that are highlighted by speaker are as follows

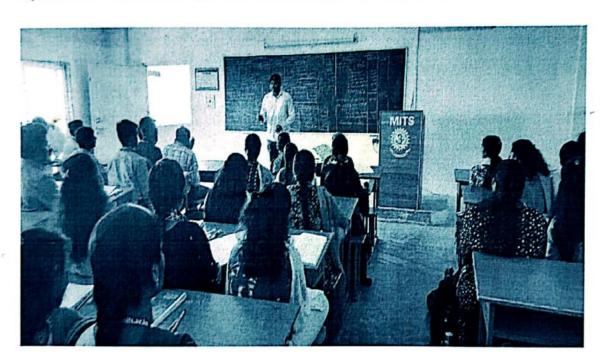


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Report of Guest Lecture on "Career opportunities in Banking Sector for MBA students"

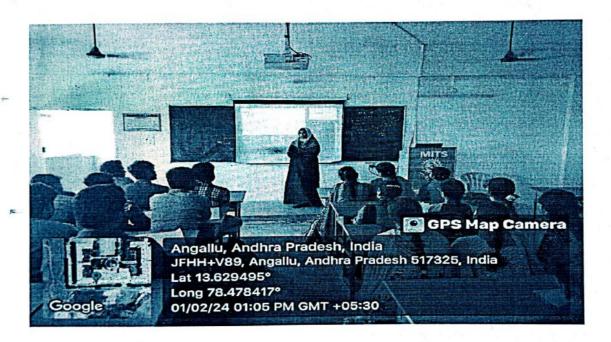
The session started with introducing Ms. Karishma, Sr. recruiter to the students by Alumni coordinator Dr. K. Venkateswarlu.

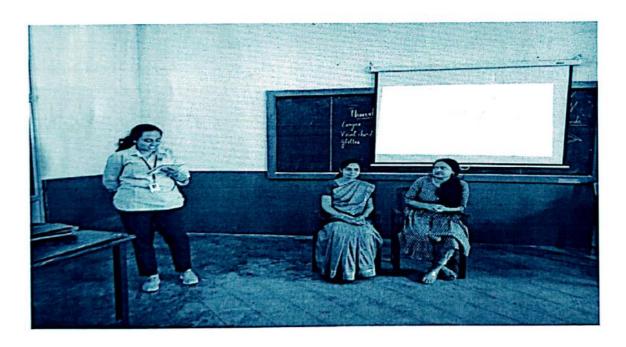
