MITS has established an active SDG Cell to coordinate and monitor sustainability initiatives across the University campus. The SDG Cell aligns institutional activities with the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development by promoting research, awareness programmes, environmental conservation, waste management, energy efficiency, water conservation, social inclusion, and community development. The University has also adopted several institutional policies related to climate action, sustainable procurement, energy-efficient infrastructure, plastic minimization, water reuse, gender equity, equality and inclusion, anti-corruption, disability accommodation, and responsible waste management. These policies are periodically reviewed and implemented through various administrative committees, ensuring that sustainability is embedded within institutional governance.

The University's Sustainability Report highlights a number of environmental projects undertaken around campus. These include measures for saving energy, using renewable sources of energy wherever possible, water management systems, systems for waste segregation and disposal, green landscaping and programmes to raise awareness of the need for responsible use of resources. The academic curriculum includes environmental education in the form of courses, seminars, workshops, project-based learning and research activities regarding topics such as renewable energy, environmental monitoring, green technologies, sustainable engineering and climate change mitigation. Faculty members and students are actively involved in tree plantation programmes, environmental awareness campaigns and Green Campus initiatives, which promote environmental responsibility among all stakeholders.

The framework for sustainability reporting additionally emphasizes the University's social responsibility activities. MITS believes in providing equal opportunities for all to access inclusive and equitable education, irrespective of gender, socio-economic background or physical ability. Student welfare continues to be a prime focus through health services, counselling facilities, wellness programmes, skill development initiatives, industry collaborations, internships, career guidance, entrepreneurship development and community engagement programmes. The University works continuously with the industries, governmental organizations and local communities to meet the challenges of society through outreach programmes, knowledge transfer, extension activities and applied research projects.

Good governance is another key pillar of the University's sustainability reporting. MITS has a well-defined governance system based on transparency, accountability, ethical conduct and regulatory compliance. Academic administration, research governance, quality assurance, grievance redressal, financial accountability, environmental management and stakeholder participation are managed by institutional committees. University encourages participatory governance through involvement of students, faculty members, administrative staff, alumni, employers and external experts in institutional decision-making through feedback systems, statutory committees and quality assurance mechanisms. Transparency and academic integrity are also promoted by the open dissemination of research outputs through publications, institutional repositories and collaborative research activities.

A major strength of MITS is the consistent publication of Annual Reports, which provide a comprehensive record of institutional achievements and activities related to sustainability. The University has a consistent history of publishing Annual Reports for a number of years and has Annual Reports available for 2022–23, 2023–24 and 2024–25, meeting the requirement for annual sustainability reporting for at least the previous three consecutive years. These reports provide comprehensive information related to academic performance, research productivity, governance initiatives, infrastructure development, quality assurance, financial performance, student achievements, extension activities, community engagement and progress



made by the institution towards sustainability objectives. This ongoing reporting is a demonstration of the University's commitment to institutional transparency and evidence-based governance.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) also reinforces sustainability reporting through the publication of Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR), institutional performance reports, quality audits, stakeholder feedback analyses, action taken reports and strategic planning documents. These documents aid the institution to improve continuously by assessing performance indicators, tracking the implementation of quality initiatives, and encouraging evidence-based decision-making. By integrating the IQAC documentation with the sustainability efforts the University is able to create a strong governance structure to comply with national accreditation and international sustainability rankings.

Digitalization enhances the accessibility and effectiveness of MITS' sustainability reporting. Annual Reports, sustainability documents, institutional policies, governance frameworks, strategic plans, SDG initiatives, and quality assurance reports are publicly available through the University's official website. This digital repository enables students, faculty, researchers, accreditation agencies, funding organizations, industry partners, government bodies, and the general public to access authentic institutional information conveniently. The University's digital governance practices promote openness, accountability, and stakeholder engagement while reducing dependence on printed documentation.

Madanapalle Institute of Technology & Science (MITS), Deemed to be University, has established dedicated committees and institutional units to coordinate sustainability-related initiatives across the campus. The university has constituted an SDG Cell as the central coordinating body to promote the integration of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into academics, research, innovation, outreach, and campus operations. The SDG Cell works in close coordination with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Green Campus Committee, Energy Management Committee, Waste Management Committee, Water Conservation Committee, NSS Unit, Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), and various academic departments to ensure effective planning, implementation, monitoring, and documentation of sustainability activities.

The major objectives of the SDG Cell include:

- Promoting awareness and implementation of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.
- Integrating sustainability principles into teaching, research, and innovation.
- Coordinating campus-wide environmental protection and resource conservation initiatives.
- Encouraging interdisciplinary research addressing environmental and societal challenges.
- Organizing workshops, seminars, awareness campaigns, outreach programmes, and sustainability competitions.
- Supporting national and international sustainability rankings, including the UI GreenMetric World University Rankings.
- Monitoring sustainability indicators and preparing institutional sustainability reports.
- Promoting collaborations with industries, government agencies, NGOs, and local communities for sustainable development projects.

The SDG Cell regularly conducts activities related to:

- Green campus development
- Tree plantation and biodiversity conservation
- Energy efficiency and renewable energy promotion
- Water conservation and rainwater harvesting
- Solid waste management and plastic reduction

MITS, Deemed to be University, Madanapalle has established a robust Information and Communication Technology (ICT) ecosystem that supports digital governance, academic excellence, and sustainable campus management. The institution integrates modern digital infrastructure with administrative and academic processes to enhance operational efficiency, reduce paper consumption, and facilitate data-driven decision-making. The campus is equipped with a high-speed 2 Gbps internet backbone provided through multiple service providers and a comprehensive Wi-Fi 6-enabled wireless network covering academic blocks, administrative offices, laboratories, classrooms, libraries, hostels, and other campus facilities. This digital infrastructure enables seamless access to online learning resources, e-governance services, virtual meetings, and institutional management systems.

To strengthen sustainability-oriented governance, MITS utilizes ICT-enabled platforms such as its institutional website, digital library, online examination and academic management systems, ERP-based administrative services, and quality assurance documentation aligned with ISO 21001:2018 Educational Organizations Management System (EOMS). The university maintains digital records, electronic communication, online admissions, newsletters, and various departmental portals that significantly minimize paper-based processes while improving transparency and institutional accountability. ICT-enabled classrooms, digital learning facilities, and online academic resources further promote sustainable teaching-learning practices.

The institution also supports continuous monitoring and improvement through ICT-enabled quality assurance mechanisms, including periodic IT infrastructure upgrades, cybersecurity policies, Wi-Fi management, and internet bandwidth monitoring as documented under its NAAC and institutional quality assurance framework. The centralized digital infrastructure facilitates efficient communication among students, faculty, administrators, and stakeholders while supporting environmental initiatives through reduced physical documentation and improved resource utilization. These ICT facilities provide a strong technological foundation for implementing future sustainability dashboards, energy monitoring systems, carbon accounting platforms, and other digital initiatives aligned with the objectives of the UI GreenMetric World University Rankings.

Grievance Redressal Cell

As per All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) regulations regarding the establishment of Mechanism for Grievance Redressal in Technical Institutions, a Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) is formed to address the grievances of the students.

The Vice-Principal - Administration is nominated as the Co-ordinator for the Grievance Redressal Committee. The student grievance can be lodged online at the website <https://mitsmadanapalle.edu/grievance.com/> or through <https://forms.office.com/r/vke9XhMFac> or send through e-mail to grc@mits.ac.in or in writing to "The Coordinator-GRC, MITS, Madanapalle - 517325". For each grievance, reported to the Committee, an enquiry committee shall be constituted under the Chairmanship of the Principal and he shall nominate the appropriate members.

The Principal will nominate the co-opt members to the Enquiry Committee as per the type and the nature of the grievance and the situation. Coordinator-GRC will chair the meeting for that particular matter.

If any of the complainants are not satisfied with the decision of the Grievance Redressal Committee, they may approach the Ombudsman in JNTUA directly. The Ombudsman shall hear to those grievances and disposes them. Within one month of receipt for early redressal of grievance.

- Ombudsperson for independent grievance resolution.



- Online grievance submission portal, institutional email support, suggestion boxes, and written complaint mechanisms.
- Transparent enquiry procedures with committee-based investigations.
- Awareness programmes, orientation sessions, gender sensitization programmes, ethics promotion, and institutional integrity initiatives.

The Grievance Redressal Committee operates according to AICTE regulations and provides several channels for complaint submission, including:

- Online grievance portal
- Institutional email
- Microsoft Forms
- Suggestion boxes
- Direct submission to Heads of Departments, Coordinator, or Principal

Each complaint is examined by an enquiry committee constituted by the Principal to ensure impartiality and fairness. If the complainant is dissatisfied, the grievance may be escalated to the University Ombudsperson and subsequently to the UGC Student Grievance Portal.

The Internal Complaints Committee functions under the POSH Act and follows a Zero Tolerance Policy towards sexual harassment. The committee regularly conducts:

- Ethics and safe-campus awareness activities

Madanapalle Institute of Technology & Science (MITS) – Deemed to be University has established a comprehensive Whistle Blowing and Complaint System to promote transparency, accountability, ethical governance, and a safe academic environment for students, faculty, staff, and other stakeholders. The University has constituted a Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE). The committee provides a structured and confidential mechanism for reporting complaints, grievances, unethical practices, and other concerns related to the functioning of the University.

The University enables stakeholders to submit complaints through multiple channels, including an online grievance portal, Microsoft Forms, official e-mail, written applications addressed to the Coordinator of the Grievance Redressal Committee, suggestion boxes, and Heads of Departments. Each complaint received is reviewed, and an enquiry committee is constituted under the Chairmanship of the Principal whenever necessary. The committee investigates complaints impartially and recommends appropriate corrective actions while maintaining confidentiality throughout the process.

MITS follows a Zero Tolerance Policy against sexual harassment and provides dedicated procedures for confidential reporting and timely resolution of complaints.

If a complainant is dissatisfied with the decision of the Grievance Redressal Committee, the matter may be escalated to the designated Ombudsperson. Students may also utilize the national grievance portals maintained by the UGC (e-Samadhaan) and AICTE for additional grievance redressal. Through this multi-level complaint and whistle-blowing framework, MITS demonstrates its commitment to integrity, fairness, accountability, transparency, and good institutional governance.

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The library operations, including the Circulation Section and Cataloging Section, are fully automated using SOUL 2.0 Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS) developed by INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad. All reading materials are classified according to the Dewey Decimal Classification scheme (23rd edition) to ensure systematic organization and easy retrieval of resources.

Students, teaching faculty, and staff are issued a single barcode-enabled Membership cum Library Identity Card. This card serves as the official library ID and can be used for borrowing books and accessing other library services.

The Library commenced its operations in 1998. It is centrally located within the institution and spreads over an area of 1,526 sq. mts., with a seating capacity to accommodate more than 500 users at a time. The Library houses a rich and extensive collection comprising 62,545 volumes of books covering 10,151 titles. In addition, it maintains 1,500 back volumes of journals and a collection of 3,382 CDs and 10,075 e-books. The library also provides a range of services to its users, including a dedicated staff for user assistance, a dedicated staff for library management, and a dedicated staff for library development.

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STUDENT HANDBOOK - CODE OF CONDUCT

Madanapalle Institute of Technology & Science (MITS), Deemed to be University has established a comprehensive Written Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct applicable to all members of the university community, including university leaders, faculty members, administrative staff, supporting staff, and students.
