Minutes of the 3rd Meeting of the Academic Council of Madanapalle Institute of Technology & Science (MITS) Deemed to be University, Madanapalle.

The 3rd Meeting of the Academic Council of Madanapalle Institute of Technology & Science (MITS) Deemed to be University, Madanapalle, was conducted through blended mode on **29th June 2026 (Monday) at 3:30 P.M. in the Board Room**, with **Dr. C. Yuvaraj, Vice-Chancellor (I/c) and Chairperson of the Academic Council**, in the chair.

Agenda Item No. 3.1: Welcoming the Members to the 3rd Academic Council Meeting.

Dr. D. Pradeep Kumar, Registrar (I/c), welcomed all the members to the 3rd Academic Council Meeting. He extended a warm welcome to the Chairperson, the External Expert Members, the Academic Council Members, and all invitees, and thanked them for their gracious presence and continued support in strengthening the academic and research ecosystem of the University.

Agenda Item No. 3.2: Condolence to Smt. Nadella Lakshmi Rajyam Garu, Treasurer, RRR Educational Academy.

Dr. C. Yuvaraj, Vice-Chancellor (I/c) and Chairperson of the Academic Council, expressed profound grief over the demise of **Smt. Nadella Lakshmi Rajyam Garu, Treasurer, RRR Educational Academy**. The members of the Academic Council conveyed their heartfelt condolences and acknowledged her invaluable contributions towards the growth and development of the institution.

The members observed a two-minute silence as a mark of respect and prayed for the eternal peace of the departed soul.

Agenda Item No. 3.3: Approval of the Minutes of the 2nd Academic Council Meeting.

Dr. D. Pradeep Kumar, Registrar (I/c), presented the minutes of the 2nd Academic Council Meeting held on 09th January 2026 before the members for consideration.

Resolution:

The Academic Council unanimously approved the minutes of the 2nd Academic Council Meeting (**Annexure – I**).

Agenda Item No. 3.4: Summary of Action Taken Report.

Dr. D. Pradeep Kumar, Registrar (I/c), presented the Summary of Action Taken Report on the resolutions and suggestions made during the 2nd Academic Council Meeting. The members appreciated the efforts made by the University in implementing the recommendations and noted the progress achieved.

3.4.1. Curriculum Structure for 4th Year B.Tech. Programmes under R25 Academic Regulations

As per the members' suggestion, the 4th Year Curriculum includes **Project Work, Internship, Skill Development, Industry Relevance and Employability** to enhance students' practical experience and job readiness. The credits pertaining to Internship, Project Work and Seminar constitute **10% of the total programme credits**, as advised by the members.

During the discussion, the **Expert Members further suggested** that:

- The **Internship credits may be enhanced to 3–5 credits.**
- The **Full Semester Internship may be shifted from the VIII Semester to the VII Semester** to facilitate better academic planning and improve learning outcomes.
- **Separate credit allocations may be considered for Summer Internship and Full Semester Internship** based on their duration, scope and expected learning outcomes.

Resolution:

Accordingly, the above recommendations shall be reworked and placed before the Council in the Upcoming Meeting.

3.4.2. Industry Collaboration for M.Tech Programmes.

Members appreciated the initiative taken and suggested continuing the same with more emphasis. (Annexure – II)

3.4.3. Introduction of New Programmes

Members appreciated the introduction of New Programmes as per the EoA (Annexure - III)

3.4.4. Quality Publications from Ph.D. Scholars

As per the members' suggestion, **Quality Publications have been made mandatory for all Ph.D. Scholars** in accordance with the Ph.D. Regulations of the University (Annexure – IV).

During the deliberations, the **Expert Members further suggested** that **a clear timeline may be prescribed for Ph.D. Scholars to publish quality research papers in reputed journals** as part of the Ph.D. programme requirements.

Resolution:

The same shall be examined and placed before the Council in the Upcoming Meeting.

Agenda Item No. 3.5: Approval of 2nd Year Syllabus Details of the UG Programmes Offered under R25 Academic Regulations.

Dr. P. Ramanathan, Professor, Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering, presented the Course Structure and Syllabus details pertaining to the following Second Year UG Programmes:

- a. B.Tech. – Civil Engineering
- b. B.Tech. – Electrical and Electronics Engineering
- c. B.Tech. – Mechanical Engineering
- d. B.Tech. – Electronics and Communication Engineering
- e. B.Tech. – Computer Science and Engineering
- f. B.Tech. – Computer Science and Engineering (Artificial Intelligence)
- g. B.Tech. – Computer Science and Engineering (Data Science)
- h. B.Tech. – Computer Science and Engineering (Cyber Security)
- i. B.Tech. – Computer Science and Engineering (Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning)

Resolution:

The Academic Council unanimously approved the Second-year Course Structure and Syllabus details of all UG programmes under R25 Academic Regulations as presented in **Annexure-V**.

Agenda Item No. 3.6: Approval of 2nd Year Syllabus Details of the PG Programmes Offered under R25 Academic Regulations.

Dr. P. Ramanathan, Professor, Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering, presented the Course Structure and Syllabus details pertaining to the following Second Year PG programmes:

- a. Master of Business Administration (MBA)
- b. Master of Computer Applications (MCA)
- c. Master of Technology – VLSI Design and Embedded Systems
- d. Master of Technology in Computer Science and Engineering

The members discussed the proposed syllabus and curriculum structure.

The Expert Members suggested:

- It has been decided to allot one credit for every two weeks of Internship.
- Maintaining uniformity in Internship credits across all PG programmes, including MBA and MCA
- Renaming the MCA course “Prompt Engineering” as “AI-Assisted Software Development.”

Resolution:

The Academic Council unanimously approved the Second-year Course Structure and Syllabus details of the PG programmes under R25 Academic Regulations as presented in **Annexure-VI**. The recommendations of the Expert Members shall be incorporated wherever appropriate.

Agenda Item No. 3.7: Discussion on NSDC Certification Courses.

Dr. C. Yuvaraj, Vice-Chancellor (I/c), presented the proposal on the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) Certification Courses for discussion.

The Expert Members suggested:

- Incorporating more practical and hands-on learning components in the NSDC courses.
- Introducing Industry Oriented certification courses.
- Providing adequate faculty training and capacity-building programmes for effective implementation of the courses.

Resolution:

The Academic Council appreciated the initiative and approved the proposal in principle. The recommendations of the Expert Members shall be considered while finalizing the course offerings and implementation framework.

Agenda Item No. 3.8: A Report on the Odd Semester End Term Examination Results.

Dr. Sai Kumar, Controller of Examinations – University, presented the report on the Odd Semester End Term Examination Results of AY (2025-2026) to the Academic Council.

The members reviewed the overall performance, pass percentages and programme-wise outcomes and appreciated the efforts taken by the faculty members and examination team.

Resolution:

The Academic Council noted the report and advised the departments to continue efforts towards improving student performance and academic outcomes (**Annexure-VII**).

Agenda Item No. 3.9: Academic Calendar for the AY 2026–27.

Dr. P. Ramanathan, Professor, Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering, presented the proposed Academic Calendars for the Year 2026–27.

The Expert Members suggested synchronizing the University Academic Calendar by addressing existing gaps and ensuring better alignment of academic, examination and evaluation schedules.

Resolution:

The Academic Council approved the Academic Calendars as presented in **Annexure-VIII**, with the recommendation that the necessary synchronization be undertaken for effective implementation.

Agenda Item No. 3.10: Report on Achievements from 9th January 2026 to till date.

Dr. P. Ramanathan, Professor, Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering, presented the report highlighting the academic, research, innovation, student, faculty, and institutional achievements from 09 January 2026 to 29 June 2026.

Resolution:

The members appreciated the significant progress made by the University in various domains (Annexure-IX).

Agenda Item No. 3.11: Any other matter with the permission of the Chair.

Dr. D. Pradeep Kumar, Registrar (I/c), presented the following additional agenda items with the permission of the Chair.

(a) Multiple Entry & Exit System and Transfer Policy:

The members have discussed the Multiple Entry & Exit System and Transfer Policy. After the deliberations it has been resolved that The University shall implement the Multiple Entry/Exit and Student Transfer Policy in accordance with the provisions of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the National Credit Framework (NCrF), the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) framework, and the guidelines issued by UGC, AICTE, and the affiliating University from time to time. Students shall be permitted to enter, exit, and re-enter academic programmes at appropriate stages based on the credits earned and accumulated in the Academic Bank of Credits, subject to fulfilment of the minimum credit requirements prescribed for the award of Certificates, Diplomas, Degrees, Honours, or other qualifications.

Transfer of students from one programme, institution, or university to another shall be facilitated through credit recognition and credit transfer mechanisms as prescribed under NEP 2020 and the applicable regulations of the concerned statutory bodies and affiliating university. Such transfers shall be subject to equivalence of courses, availability of seats, fulfilment of programme requirements, and approval by the competent authorities. A Equivalency Check Committee shall be constituted for smooth implementation.

All provisions relating to Multiple Entry/Exit, credit accumulation, credit transfer, and student mobility shall be governed by the regulations and guidelines issued by the competent authorities from time to time.

(b) Minimum Eligibility Criteria for UG / PG Admissions:

In addition, Concerning the Minimum Eligibility Criteria for UG / PG Admissions, it has been resolved that, a candidate seeking admission to any UG or PG Programme shall have secured a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade in the qualifying examination prescribed for the respective programme. A relaxation of 5% marks (or equivalent grade) shall be provided to candidates belonging to OBC (Non-Creamy Layer), SC, ST, EWS, and other categories as permitted by the applicable Statutory Bodies, Government regulations, and University norms. Accordingly, such candidates shall be eligible for admission with a minimum of 45% marks or equivalent grade in the qualifying examination.

(c) MINOR / MAJOR / HONORS Program:

With respect to Minor / Major / Honors Program, it has been resolved that Minor, Major, and Honors Programmes shall be offered and implemented in accordance with the provisions, guidelines, and credit framework prescribed under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the applicable regulations issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC), AICTE, and the affiliating University from time to time. Students shall be eligible to pursue Minor, Major, and Honours pathways subject to the prescribed credit requirements, academic performance criteria, and other conditions specified in the relevant regulations.

(d) NFSU MoU:

The members have been apprised that MITS Deemed to be University has signed an MoU with National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU) for Academic Collaboration, Internships, Research, Training, and Skill Development. The members have congratulated and advised that the activities under this MoU should be conducted periodically for the benefit of MITS Stakeholders and Society at large.

Agenda Item No. 3.12: Vote of Thanks.

Dr. D. Pradeep Kumar, Registrar (I/c), proposed the Vote of Thanks. He expressed his sincere gratitude to the Chairperson, the External Expert Members, the Academic Council Members, and all invitees for their valuable suggestions, active participation, and continued support in the successful conduct of the meeting.

The Chairperson thanked all the members for their active participation and constructive guidance and declared the meeting concluded.
